Q1: Where are your campuses located?

We currently have three campuses:

- Los Angeles, California
- New York City, New York
- Long Branch, New Jersey

Q2: What are the ages of your students?

We welcome students starting from the age of 14, with no upper age limit. While most of our students are adults aged 20-35, we also have a significant number of learners in their 30s, 40s, and beyond. Our diverse age range fosters a dynamic and inclusive learning environment.

Q3: How many levels are offered?

We offer six levels, from Level 1 to Level 6. Additionally, we provide a TOEFL Test Preparation Course.

Admissions and Visa Information

Q1: What is an I-20?

An I-20 form is issued by the school and Exchange Visitor Program (SEVP) to students accepted to a certified school. It indicates that the student's primary purpose for coming to the U.S. is to study.

Q2: How long does it take to get my I-20?

- **Digital Delivery:** 2-3 days after completing the online application and paying the \$150 registration fee + \$50 digital fee.
- **Physical Delivery via FedEx:** Approximately 2 weeks.

Q3: What is an I-901?

The I-901 is a \$350 SEVIS fee required by U.S. immigration. You must show proof of payment when applying for a student visa at the U.S. embassy.

Q4: Can I study if my student visa has expired?

Yes, as long as you maintain active status on your I-20 (SEVIS), you can continue studying in the U.S.

Q5: Can I enter the U.S. before my program starts?

Yes, with a valid F-1 visa, you can enter up to 30 days before your program start date.

Programs

Q1: Can I change my program after enrolling?

Yes, you can change your program with your teacher's advisement at the beginning of a new session.

Q2: Will I receive a certificate upon completion?

Yes, you will receive a certificate of completion or participation after successfully completing Level 6.

Q3: Can I transfer to a U.S. college without a TOEFL score after studying here?

Yes, by completing Level 5 or Level 6, depending on the university and program, you can transfer to our partner colleges or universities without taking the TOEFL exam.

Q4: What is the average class size?

Our average class size is 10 students.

Teachers

Q1: Are your teachers native speakers?

Yes, our teachers are native English speakers. They are college graduates and hold teaching certifications.

Student Status and Visa

Q1: Can I take a vacation during my studies?

Yes, after successfully completing 26 weeks of study, you are eligible for a vacation of 4 or 8 weeks.

Q2: Can I apply for a change of status with Just English if I have a B1/B2 visa?

Yes, you can apply for an F-1 student visa by providing the necessary documents.

Q3: How long can I stay in the U.S. after finishing my course?

You can stay up to 60 days after completing your program, provided you maintain good academic and attendance standing.

Q1: Is health insurance required?

No, but we highly recommend getting health insurance because healthcare costs in the U.S. are very high.

Q2: Can I get a driver's license with an F-1 visa?

Yes, you can obtain a valid driver's license with your F-1 visa by passing the written and driving tests at the DMV.

Q3: What activities or events do you offer?

We offer a variety of academic and extracurricular activities, including:

- **Academic Activities:** Speaking clubs, library access, college visits, and museum trips.
